Teach a New Sight Word (3 minutes)

Step 1: What's Missing?

- **1. Segment** the sounds. Say the word and have students segment the sounds.
- 2. Map the word. Write the letter(s) as students say each sound. Point out any unexpected spellings.
- **3. Erase** a letter and show the board to the students. "What's missing?" Write the missing letter in the word.
- **4. Repeat** the process, prompting students to use the sounds to recall the missing letter(s).

Step 2: Mix and Fix.

- **1. Build the word.** Students use magnetic letters to build the word.
- 2. **Map the word.** Students push up the letters as they say each sound.
- **3. Mix and Fix.** Students mix up the letters and rebuild the word.
- **4. Check it.** Students run their finger under the word, matching the sounds to letters.

Step 3: Table Writing.

- **1. Finger-writing.** Students use their index finger to write the word on the table.
- **2. Map the word.** Be sure they say the sound as they write the letter(s).

Step 4: Write and Retrieve.

- Cover the word. Use an index card to cover the word.
- Write the word. Students write the word on a whiteboard, saying each sound as they write the letters. They can check the letters under the index card if they need to.
- **3. Check it.** Students run their finger under the word, matching the sounds to letters.
- **4. Write a familiar word.** Students write a word they know.
- **5. Write the new word**. Students write the word they have just learned.
- 6. **Check it.** Lift the index card and check the word.

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
